"VIA 13 IS NOW HIS-STORY"



[3/31] Today is the "eve" of April Fool's Day, & also my 42nd spiritual birthday. In 16+ years of writing these newsletters, I cannot recollect one time writing it the day before! But, alas, that is the nature of *Via Dolorosa* this year. It is the 2nd biggest workload of the year for me-a close 2nd to the 4 summer camps I do, encompassing a ¼ of a year. In fact, it is common to start thinking & planning for this *Easter* season production before *Christmas!* As I do for camp counselors in the Spring, in late Fall I survey our church body for potential actors. Altogether there are about 100 people in our cast & crew each year, most from Immanuel Church-a congregation of about 400. Given I oversee the Roman sector of Via, my particular recruits tend to be Romans orJewish Zealots.

"FRIENDS, ROMANS, COUNTRYMEN-START YOUR ENGINES!"



Being the "head Roman" in Via, viz, "Pontius Pilate", I'm taking my liberty to misquote that famous line from Shakespeare's Julius Caesar, which, by the way, I'm into watching my 3rd version of it right now, initially for Via preparation. I'm listening to the "Map of Jerusalem" song from The Robe soundtrack right now-one of my top 3 favorite movies. Speaking of the music, one of my many duties/tasks/responsibilities once the engines of Via "start", is music compilation & editing. I have compiled & edited-down to the second(!), dozens of songs from my various Bible movie soundtracks to use for the many Romanesque stations of Via: The Roman Courtyard, Herod's Palace, The Antonia Stairwell, Claudia's Quarters, The Antonia Hallway, The Fortress Antonia, & The Dungeon. In addition to recruiting the actors mentioned above, I'm also responsible to costume many of them. Several bins of clothing, leather military tunics [made from women's coats bought at thrift stores], belts, breastplates, sandals, boots, helmets, weapons, & other often homemade various & sun-dry "era" props are brought from my home. Costume modification & repairs are also always involved. Actors also need orienting, directing, training, etc. I've written a # of the scripts for Via. An astute devotee of Bible movies will recognize many lines from them in my monologues. If I am praised as a actor, as you will see below, it is for 3 reasons: Jesus has gifted me with it to bring Him glory, to bless His people, & to reach the lost. I merely imitate other actors I admire, often practicing while watching them-their facial expressions, pauses, & inflections. This year I

also painted two new Roman banners, both of which I wish so very much I would have made them several years ago: "Pontius Pilatus Praefectus" & "Ave Caesar".

"IT'S A SETUP!"



It seems I hardly had taken down our Christmas tree, when Via set-up began. Many, many days involving hauling & lifting bins, setting up tarps, "stone" walls, fabric, 30+ electric "candle" lanterns, chains [found on the highways over the many years], Roman standards, shields, signs, a Roman "pyramid/monument" & flag, overhead "can" lights [I make them from coffee "cans"], etc. Despite the fact that this, our 13th year of Via was the most prepared re: set-up I have ever been, yet still I was scrambling with several last-minute prop installations, tweaks, & repairs. As with my summer camps & preparations for them, by the time opening day comes of the actual event, I'm spent, drained, exhausted, & empty for it-feeling I have nothing to give. While in my self I detest this place, it is a very good place to be. I truly believe our God so ordains & orchestrates it that way. This ensures He gets the glory as for me to pull it off it has to be entirely by His grace & strength.

"THE GLORY & GORY OF THE MINISTRY"



I've often said through the years with some-what tongue-in-cheek, "Ministry would be great if you didn't have to work with people!". One of the best & one of my most-favorite aspects of Via is how much of our church family it involves. The cast entails children, youth, young adults, middle-aged, & many senior saints. It is one of the beauties of Via. Our church is very missions & outreach-minded, but nothing we do the rest of the year comes close to Via re: whole-church involvement. And yet, with people, come problems. It must be so. We have saints in Via who have walked with the Lord for decades, & those who have known Him for only a short time-babes in Christ. Hence, at Via each year-every year-we have issues. We wouldn't be human & Christian without them. To be honest, many times I have wanted to walk away from it all. Even this year, just a few months ago, I felt my time in Via was over-that I, & maybe it (?), had run its course. This is all the more curious, as oftentimes I feel as if I "live" in Via-its era, its music, its atmosphere-in the Bible movies of the 50's & 60's. And I want to stay there. I "zone-out" in Via many times. Even now, listening to the soundtrack of The Greatest Story Ever Told [perhaps my official Via "theme" music over the many years?], I want to go back to Via. I want to live there. I'm heartsick that it is over for another year, Lord willing. As much of a strain, stress, exhausting enterprise as it is, I wish last week was only a "warm-up" to do it next week. Every year it just kills me inside re: how fast the week of Via goes. Oh God. I know He will help me.



Once again, as I've done so many times during the Via season, I "fell on" my pastor, Bill Breon. I feel as if he "endures" me every year at Via-my angst, stress, etc. He seems not to mind! When I felt like I was finished with it, he turned on the lights for me, hence, "Breon's Neon". He helped me to see that I do much more in Via than just act. I actually help him pastor & shepherd many people through its several weeks of preparation, setup, & performance. Another golden aspect of this production is that many brothers who are not typically "seen or heard" re: in Immanuel's limelight the rest of the year, come out of their wood-work, so to speak, during Via Dolorosa. They "put on the greasepaint", or more accurately, charcoal, & help impact over a thousand people each year.

"THE SHOW MUST GO ON!"



So, despite all of the behind-the-scenes' struggles & issues each year, our God has so graciously enabled this ministry to continue. What makes it all worth it is the feedback we get from the public who walked through it. This year, amazingly, about 75% of the people who went through Via had never been! I've copied & pasted below various comments from people's texts, emails, FB messages, etc., basically, as they came to me. Jesus be praised & blessed for them all. Sincerely, "The Procurator".

SO MANY ..TO DO SUCH A SUPERB JOB! THE PREPARATION, THE PRACTICING .HOW DID YOU DO IT? SOUND EFFECTS, LIGHTING. I KNOW THAT JESUS IS APPLAUDING YOU TOO. TO ALL THAT I DID NOT MENTION, MY APOLOGIES! I SAW YOU ALL. I APPRECIATED YOU ALL.AND THEN AT THE END YOU GAVE US A CHANCE TO RESPOND TO WHAT WE WERE FEELING. OH. MY!!THE CRUCIFIXION! HOW DID HE DO THAT EVERY 15 MIN.? IT WAS GREAT THAT YOU RELATED IT TO PRESENT DAYS. I AM PRAYING FOR THOSE WHO FOUND THEIR PERSONAL JESUS THROUGH YOUR EFFORTS.AND FOR THE OTHERS WHO HAD OTHER BUSINESS TO TAKE CARE OF WITH GOD. I KNOW GOD WILL BLESS YOU ALL FOR YOUR EFFORTS AND PRAY THAT YOU WILL CONTINUE THIS MINISTRY AS LONG AS POSSIBLE. THANK YOU ALL FOR LETTING ME SIT AND REACT AND BE THAT PART OF IT! (I TAUGHT FOR MANY YEARS IN ONE OF THOSE CLASSROOMS ON THE SECOND FLOOR FOR WILMINGTON CHRISTIAN SCHOOL AND LOVED REVISITING THERE.) *Hi Stephen...I wanted to thank you for inviting me to come to the Via Dolorosa production last night. I had quite a busy day yesterday and almost did not go. I hate to admit it but I did not have high expectations of the evening. Way too many of these productions are OK but quite boring. Not this one! From the start, I was immersed in

the time period and felt like I was walking the weathered streets of old Jerusalem. The sets were great and the performance was as professional as any stage performance! I want so very much to rest-& yet-there is more work to be done. Each day, without exception, I number my days. I am constantly aware of how fast the days rush by & the years come on. Now is the time to preach the excellencies of Christ. I'm am constantly made aware through theological YouTubes I frequently watch, re: the desperate & decadent times we live in. Both young & old inundate themselves daily with the vanity & filth of the world via incessant images & messages via social media. They must be preached to. Hence, despite how spent I feel right now [that's why I'm not writing this until the day before it "goes to press"!], I have already been praying for open doors of ministry in the near future.
